n ancient times the coronation of a monarch involved the display of great splendor and pageantry. The king would be dressed in the most expensive robes and jewels and would be driven through his capital city in an ornate carriage drawn by stately horses.

Accompanying him would be his courtiers and foreign dignitaries and following that would be many the nation's finest soldiers. In many countries high-ranking religious leaders would also participate.

Matthew portrays the most significant coronation the world has yet seen, but it was a coronation in marked contrast to the kind just described. It was the coronation of a *true* King. He was affirmed as King and was, in a sense, inaugurated into His kingship. But there was no pomp, no splendor, and a nondescript sort of pageantry.
